

Parent's Corner: You're Hungry

During the summer months, children are often home more. And it can seem like they are always hungry! Here are some tips to keep summer snacking, and your grocery costs, under control.

• Set routine meal and snack times: When family members know when meals will be served, the day can be better planned. Snacks help provide children the nutrients they need. Each 3 to 4 hours, offer a meal or snack.

• **Protein, fat, and fiber**: Building snacks around these three things will help keep children full until their next meal. Snacks like chips, crackers, and snack cakes are empty calories. Not only are they not healthy, they don't help with hunger. Instead, try healthy, filling snacks like carrots and hummus, yogurt and fruit, or a cheese stick and whole-wheat crackers.

• Eat in the kitchen: Skip mindless munching in front of the TV. Ask your family to eat in the kitchen. This will also help cut down on wrappers and crumbs all over the house.


Piggy Bank Contest




Record Book, Secretary Books, and Community Pride Reports are Due!!
