ATTENTION LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

If you plan to show livestock this year (market and/or breeding animals) you must complete your educational hours (and notify Janet Turley of your intent to show) no later than <u>Tuesday</u>, May 14.

MARKET ANIMAL exhibitors (sheep, goat, swine) must tag their animals at a Livestock Validation site. The closest site for Warren County Exhibitors will be at the L.D. Brown Exposition Center on <u>Tuesday, May 14, 5-7 p.m.</u> at Barn #3 (closest to Bennett Lane). Contact Janet Turley for the paperwork you need to complete and bring to the validation site.

New for 2024- All youth livestock exhibitors must have a Premise ID for the location of their livestock. Most farms should already have this number, if not, parents will have to apply for one. Turnaround time should take 2-3 days. Start early on this process so you can have the number for your market animal/breeding paperwork.

YAIP-3RD YEAR OF FUNDING

The Warren County 4-H Council received YAIP funding for the 3rd year in a row from the Kentucky Ag Development Fund. The 4-H Council received \$30,000 to distribute on a 50-50 cost share basis for Warren County youth agriculture projects. A total of 34 youth applied for funding and will receive up to \$882.35.
