




## 4-H Global Table



## Environmental Education Camps

The Warren County 4-H Program is trying something new this year - Environmental Education Camps. This overnight experience will target 4<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms and their teachers along with parent chaperones. This is an overnight experience where students will immerse themselves in the environment. Students will learn about the following: mammals, bird adaptations and owl pellets. There will be a lake study, nature hike, enviroscapes, night hike and optional canoeing/kayaking and shooting sports. The cost is \$36/person plus transportation. ## Leadership Boot Camp

The Kentucky 4-H Program is hosting a 4-H Leadership Boot Camp for teens 14-18 years old. This Boot Camp will be on February 2-3, 2023 at the Lake Cumberland 4-H Camp in Jabez, KY. This 24 hour camp will be for teens who want to learn more about leadership roles and how to take the next step in their leadership journey.

During this educational experience youth will have the opportunity to develop their leadership skills in a fast paced, team-focused environment. ## Career Shadowing Project

**Career Shadowing Projects Books – Due by January 20**th

Take advantage of the 4-H Career Shadowing Project. 4-H members who start this project in the fifth grade can shadow eight different careers by the time they graduate high school. This is a short term project for youth in the 5th-12th grade. Youth must complete a project book according to grade level and turn in the completed project book January 17-20, 2022. During the month of February, youth will be matched with a business host. All youth will be required to attend a career orientation on February 23rd at 6 p.m. at the Extension Office. Shadowing dates will be March 7, 23, and 29. 4-H members will get to shadow on one of these dates. Any youth 5th grade and up is eligible to participate in the 4-H Careers Project.

## Cost Share Program

YAIP (Youth Agricultural Incentives Program) is a financial incentives program to encourage youth to engage in and explore agricultural opportunities. This program is for youth enrolled in elementary, middle or high school including home school students in Warren County. Applicants must be at least 9 years of age by January 1, 2022. Recipients of YAIP will be eligible for cost-share money on a 50/50 basis. Eligible investment areas include: Agricultural Diversification (Greenhouse, Horticulture, Hydroponics & Aquaponics, Technology- Computer Software, Value-added & Marketing, and Wildlife management), Animal Production (Beef, Dairy, Goat, Equine, Sheep, Rabbit, Swine, Poultry, Bees, livestock Barns); Forage and Grain Improvement; Showmanship; Supervised Agriculture Experience (SAE); and Country Ham Projects. Recipients of YAIP must have a mentor and make a presentation to mentor and peers related to their project or organize 1 event in partnership with 4-H, FFA or another agricultural organization. They must also complete a minimum of 2 hours educational component. Recipients will receive up to a maximum of \$1500 depending on the number who apply. Each recipient will be pro-rated the same amount of money. The Warren County Ag Development Council allotted the Warren County 4-H Council \$25,000 to administer this program. The Warren County 4-H Shooting Sports program will be cranking up in February and we do not want you to miss out. Each participant of the 4-H Shooting Sports program must attend *one safety meeting* before they can participate in our program. Three safety session dates have been set (participants must attend 1): February 20, March 23, April 17, all are located at the Warren County Extension Office at 6 p.m. All participants should plan to attend the mock range on April 24. After these safety sessions are completed range work will begin at the Green River Gun Club.

Our shooting sports program will offer the following disciplines this year: BB Rifle, Air Sport Rifle, Air Target Rifle, .22 Sport Rifle, .22 Target Rifle, .22 Pistol, Air Pistol, 12 and 20 gauge Trap (25, 50, 100 rounds), Black Powder Rifle (any caliber)- Flintlock and Percussion and Black Powder Pistol, and the following Archery classes: Bowhunter, Target Compound, Target Compound, Target Recurve, Compound Bare Bow, and Bare Recurve/Long Bow.

This program cannot be conducted without our 20 certified volunteers who give their time and skills once each week during the summer to safely prepare our 4-H members for competition.
