Gear Up! It's Shooting Sports Season!

The 4-H Shooting Sports Program is off to a great start this year. They have completed three safety trainings for 4-H members, hosted a day long shooting sports camp, started weekly practices, worked on hosting a shooting sports tournament, and working hard to prepare a 4-H teen for a national shooting event.

For the 2nd year in a row, the "Sweet Team" has organized and coordinated a 4-H Shooting Sports Day Camp. Thirty-five participants learned about shooting sports and the importance of safety while using firearms and bows. Extra thanks to our 9 adult coaches, 11 teen coaches, and additional volunteers for taking time out of their busy schedules to make the camp special and educational.

Did you know that Warren County has one of the largest 4-H Shooting Sports Programs in the state? We are fortunate to have 14 certified adult coaches and 14 certified teen coaches in the following disciplines: Archery, Rifle, Pistol, Black Powder, Trap, and Coordinator. They have a whopping 58 certifications (many have more than one certification).

Grab a Win Today!

Do your children want to push peas around the plate instead of eating them? Then you might have thought about sneaking a few veggies into their foods.

While this can help children eat more vegetables, it should not be your only game plan. If you are always hiding vegetables, how will they get to know and enjoy them? You don't need to hide veggies on a routine basis. But, if you have a picky eater, hiding them a little can be a helpful way to get more produce into their food.

When it comes to getting children to happily eat veggies, the more choices the better. So go ahead and fold mushrooms into meatloaf and shred carrots into spaghetti sauce. Top pizza with onions and peppers, sprinkle tomatoes and avocados on tacos, or fold butternut squash into mac and cheese.
